Minor Checklist

This minor is intended to provide students with the opportunity to explore the archaeology and art of the ancient Mediterranean world. Students will acquire a broad archaeological, historical and cultural overview, before turning to more specific courses dealing with the artistic production and material conditions of Greek and Roman society. The minor is designed so that students may follow different "tracks," emphasizing—if they choose—study of either the Greek or Roman world.
