Requirements for a German Minor

PREREQUISITES: German 101, 102, and 231 or the equivalent, as determined by the departmental placement examination. Credits obtained through retroactive credits (232 or higher) or AP credits (232 or higher) will <u>not</u> count towards the minor.

REQUIREMENTS: No less than 18 hours at the level of German 232 or higher. The Conversation courses (306) will count towards a minor if the class is graded (Winter 2014 and later). Students must take either German 325 or 326. Either 325 or 326 may be repeated one time, provided the content is different. At least 12 credits counting towards the 18-hour total must be taught in German, and at least one course must be numbered 400 or above. This 400-level course can be taught in German or in English. Students are strongly encouraged to give further coherence to their programs by electing courses within the same "German Studies sequence".

INTERNSHIPS: If students completed a summer-internship program in Germany, Switzerland or Austria, and enrolled in German 351 (1-3 credits) the following Fall, the credits will count towards the minor.

STUDY ABROAD: If students study abroad through a program affiliated with the University of Michigan (Academic Year in Freiburg, Winter term in Tübingen), the credits will count provided that the classes are taught in German. For all other students: at least 9 credits for the minor must be taken as regular University of Michigan credits.
