


Natalie Angell USGLC


Catherine Hadley Patriotic Millionaires


Chloe Hale


Keith Johnstone House Committee on Science, Space, and Technology


Alex Marotti Anti-Defamation League


Joshua Nicklin American Legislative Exchange Council


Katherine Springer Georgetown Center for Global Health Science and Security and Pandemic Action Network
