

Arabic Language and Culture in Amman

The Basics

- Location: Amman, Jordan
- Fall | Winter
- Provider: <u>CET</u>
- Academics: 15-18 credits (4-5 courses)
 - Modern Standard Arabic (required; 6 credits)
 - Jordanian Dialect (required, 3 credits)
 - Two-three electives content-based language courses to meet the recommended credits (3 credits each)
- Housing: Apartment
- Instruction in Arabic and English
- Internship or Directed Research options available
- Advisor: Rachel Reuter

Language and Culture in Rabat

- Location: Rabat, Morocco
- Fall | Winter | Academic Year
- Provider: <u>IES</u>
 - The IES Abroad application (Part 1 and Part 2) must be in by the CGIS deadline.
- Academics: 15-18 credits (5-6 courses)
 - IES Modern Standard Arabic course (required; 6 credits)
 - <u>IES Areas Study courses</u> (at least two-three required; 3 credits each)
 - English- or French taught courses
 - Courses at Université Mohammed V (optional; 3 credits each)
 - French- or Arabic-taught courses
 - IES Colloquial Moroccan Arabic (optional; 3 credits)
- Housing: Homestay (with three daily meals included)
- Advisor: Rachel Reuter

Review the M-Compass brochure of your program of interest (including the eligibility criteria). When ready, click Apply Now. Carefully read and complete the application requirements by the CGIS deadline.

If indicated on the M-Compass brochure and application, complete an application on the provider's portal. Links should be provided on M-Compass. The provider's application must also be submitted by the CGIS deadline.

All the M-Compass and provider's (if applicable) application requirements must be submitted by the CGIS application deadline.
Go to the Dates tab on the M-Compass brochure to double check the CGIS program deadline.

Course Credit and Advising

- LSA students receive Michigan in-residence credit for participating in CGIS programs. Credits appear on your academic record and are applicable toward your U-M degree.
- Non-LSA students should contact their home school or college concerning the applicability of LSA courses and Michigan in-residence credits.
- Earn credit towards distribution and/or other majors/minors with pre-approval. Meet with your academic and/or department advisor to check on course approvals and equivalencies

The MES Arabic Program

Courses are based on an integrated approach that prepares students to communicate in both MSA (FuSHa) and Levantine Arabic (Shaami).

	Fall	Winter
First year	Arabic 101 (5 crt)	Arabic 102 (5 crt)
Second year*	Arabic 201 (5 crt)	Arabic 202 (5 crt)
Third year	Arabic 401 (5 crt)	Arabic 402 (5 crt)
Fourth year	Arabic 501 (3 crt) Arabic 504 (4 crt)	Arabic 511 (4 crt)
Levantine Arabic	Arabic 425 (4 crt)	Arabic 426 (4 crt)

^{*} Spring/Summer: Arabic 203 (10 credits), combines both Arabic 201 & Arabic 202

The LSA Language Requirement: complete Arabic 202 (C- or better) or be placed in Arabic 401 through the Arabic placement test.



The MES Arabic Program

Arabic Studies Minor

Take a minimum of 19 credits that fulfill the following requirements:

- Arabic 401, Advanced Arabic I (5 credits) & Arabic 402, Advanced Arabic II (5 credits)
- At least 3 credits of an elective language course taught in Arabic
- At least 6 credits of elective Arabic content courses taught in English

Study abroad programs

- CGIS approved programs: Jordan & Morocco
- Students need to consult with the Arabic Language Director to receive information on preferred programs and approvals of courses that match Arabic courses here at U-M
- Students may use study abroad credit to complete Arabic 401 & Arabic 402
- If wanting to use language credit from study abroad, students must take the Arabic Placement Exam
 upon return
