

South Asian Course Offerings for Winter 2015

The following courses cover South Asia to varying degrees, from 25% to 100%. **For Center MA students**, for the course to count toward the degree course requirement, at least one-third of your effort (e.g., papers, readings) must be related to South Asia. Therefore, verify with the instructor beforehand that you will be able to meet the requirement for courses you elect with less than 100% area content.

Some 400 level courses carry graduate credit, others do not. It is up to the student to determine the credit status of the course by verifying with the home department. Consult the LSA Course Guide for course restrictions and prerequisite requirements.
