In the ancient Greek and Roman world, coins were an important tool for trade. Just like today, coins were used to buy things like food and materials and to pay wages. Also like today, coins were usually decorated with images that told you who was responsible for creating the coin (the king, the state, the emperor). The art on ancient coins was also an important tool for civic identity, political propaganda, and demonstrating authority.
