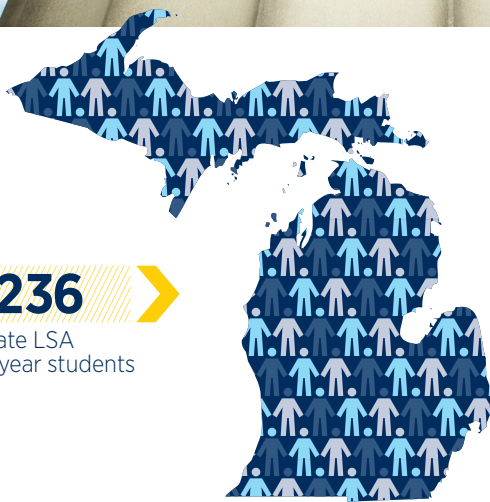

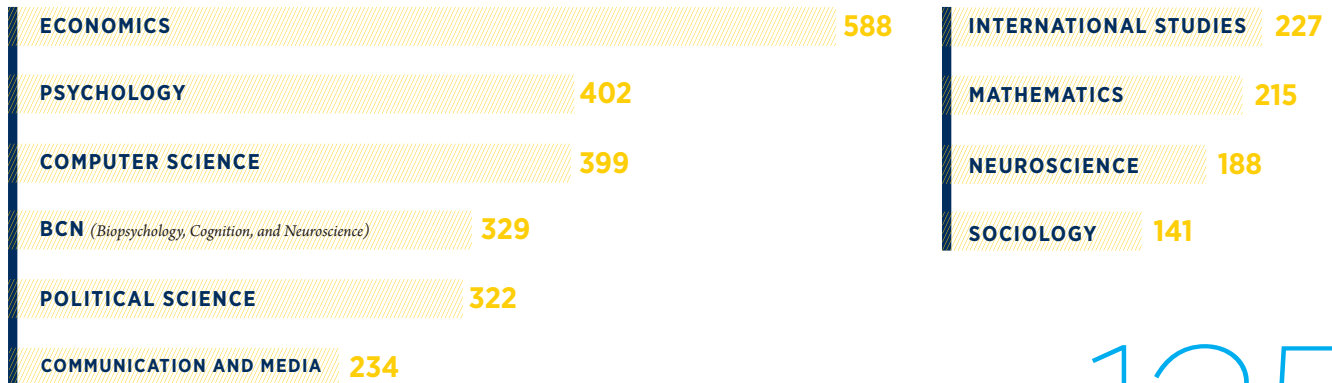

## TOP 10 MAJORS

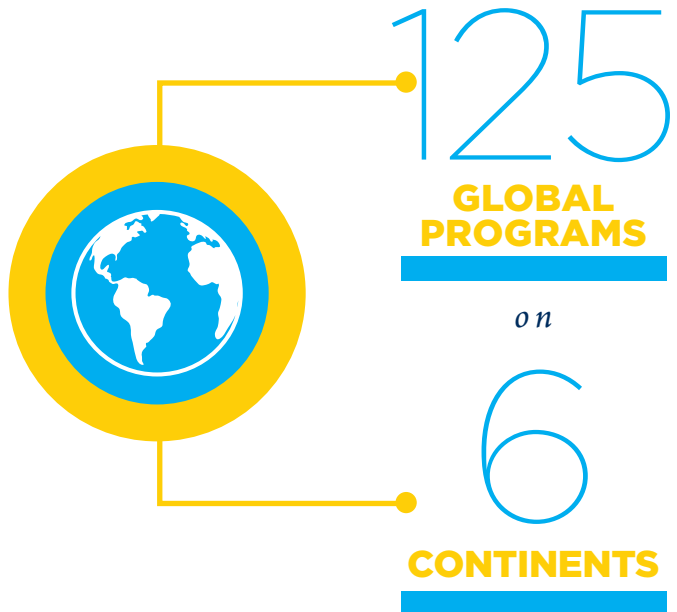

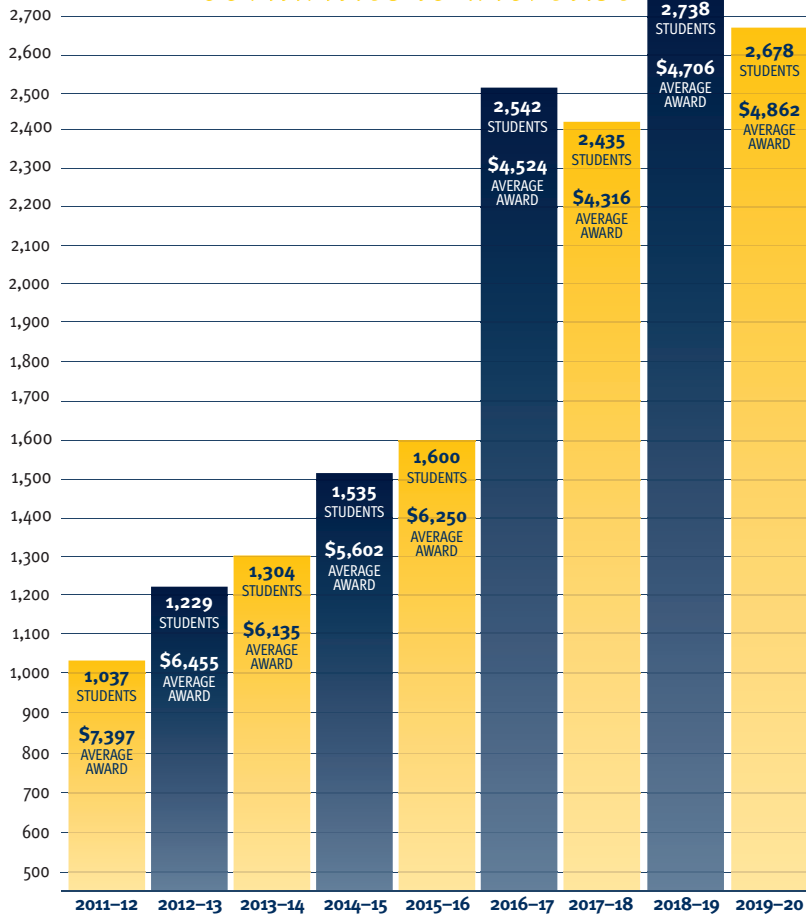

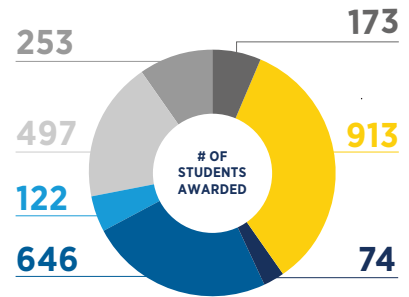

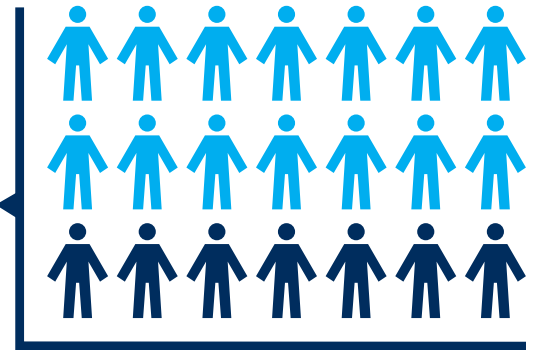
## ENDOWED PROFESSORSHIPS in LSA
