- a. Stoneman, Max

We've worked with students for clean energy to fund a solar panel block M on north campus, of course this will be a small fraction of energy use on campus but it is very public and visible and will get the community more aware of the switch to renewable energy. It's been a successful semester and it's been excellent to hear for other committees to see what they're working on.
