My **first line of research** continues to clarify and articulate the confluence of multiple individual and social-level characteristics (structural determinants of health: SDH) associated with HIV-related infection, propagation, treatment and mortality trajectories of urban African American heterosexual drug dependent men in Midwest urban cities. My **second line of research** expands work on Black men at risk to include the friends and family networks of these men residing in urban neighborhoods in Detroit. I focused on the impacts and context of digitally-informed social change strategies on direct and indirect mitigation effects of the “digital divide” as a social policy level SDH that perpetuates risk factors contributing to excess illness and mortality for children, youth, and families in Detroit urban communities. This work documents the short- and medium-term community impact of two art based, digital education and local fabrication models of community development within the (1) Kellogg Youth Initiative Partnership (2008-2015) and (2) the Skillman Foundation’s “Good Neighborhoods Initiative” (2005-2017). My **third line of research** follows community trajectories and the lives of residents in six communities in Detroit between 1990-2020+. My work documents the longer term cycles of prevention and promotion of positive long term impacts of HIV-related cognitive and behavioral change programs upon (1) men (and their friends and family networks) living in historically politically, socially and economically fragile communities and (2) health benefits and disparities emerging from syndemic-structural interactions, e.g. HIV/AIDS, poverty, violence-related PTSD, digital divides, rapidly dissipating industrial employment and impoverished care access. I further examine the implementation of community development concepts including but not limited to radical inclusion, non-extraction, community benefit optimization, productive sustainability and cooperative community ownership within modestly resourced urban working-class neighborhoods in Detroit.

Collectively, my scholarly work contributes to codifying and surfacing distinct models of community development deployed within urban working-class neighborhoods. I envision neighborhoods where residents interact with social services, education and health systems within a context imbricating efficient embedding of art, digital, fabrication and design spaces, well-articulated models of social justice equity, and efficient technologies within community development efforts.

My neighborhood-based prevention and promotion related work and research has been supported by the National Institutes of Health, Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and numerous private foundations.
