Research Interests

My research examines under-investigated research questions in developmental psychology. Specifically, I study the role of mitigating factors such as family, religion, and culture in identity development for lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, and queer (LGBTQ+) young adults. I aim to increase understanding about how both marginalization and resilience impact the lives of individuals living with multiple stigmatized identities, such as living with HIV, having an LGBTQ+ sexual identity, and/or being a person of color. I also maintain a research lab in which I train undergraduate research assistants in online data collection methods (quantitative), semi-structured interviews (qualitative), as well as data analysis with those and other methods. This work is essential as LGBTQ+ individuals, people living with HIV, people of color, and those at the intersection of all three, are systematically oppressed domestically and

abroad. As psychologists, we must examine the challenges to well-being and the ways in which individuals thrive through adversity.
