Call for Papers

The Society for Exact Philosophy invites submissions of papers in all areas of analytic philosophy for its 2018 meeting. Please share this notice with interested colleagues and graduate students.

Subject to funding, the conference may be able to provide reduced conference fees and/or subsidies for accommodation costs for selected graduate students and non-tenured/non-tenure-track researchers who are accepted to present papers. Details will be announced on this site when they become available.

Paper submission deadline: **21 January 2018**.

Submission Instructions

Authors are requested to submit their papers according to the following guidelines. Papers must be

- 1) prepared for anonymous refereeing,
- 2) in PDF file format, and
- 3) sent as an email attachment to
[our submission address](#)
with a subject line containing the key-phrase "SEP submission", and where
- 4) the body text of the email message should constitute a cover page for the submission by including
 - i) author's name, ii) affiliation, iii) paper title, and iv) short abstract.

All submissions will receive email confirmation of receipt. *If your submission does not soon result in a receipt confirmation, please send an inquiry to [Marcus Rossberg](#).*

Length

You should plan on having 40 minutes presentation time. We suppose this to be the principal guide in judging the length of the paper you send. It is the norm at SEP meetings for speakers to present rather than read their papers (and this is a virtue), so it is to be expected that presentation time and page length will only loosely correlate.

That said, do please bear in mind that paper referees need to both grasp the content of your paper and be able to readily envisage how you could present it in the available time. So, if your paper runs long, you might for this reason want to prepare a shortened version.

(If you prefer a page number specification to this human guideline: 15 double-spaced pages is a common norm for 40 minute talks.)

Getting There
