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**MAJOR REQUIREMENTS**

- A minimum of 30 credits numbered 235 and above.
- At least 12 credits are required to be taught in Italian. Of these:
  - At least one course taught in Italian at the 200-level (235 or above)
  - At least one course taught in Italian at the 300-level.
  - At least one course taught in Italian at the 400-level.
- At least one course at either the 300 or 400-level, taught in Italian, must be taken in RLL at the Ann Arbor campus.
- At least one course focused on Italian literature and/or culture of periods prior to 1900.

**Residence Requirement**

- A maximum of 15 out-of-residence credits are permitted. All other credits must be in-residence: taken on UM campus or with a study abroad program affiliated with UM (CGIS).

**Study Abroad Courses**

- Italian majors are encouraged to consider study abroad programs with an emphasis on Italian immersion. Consult with an Italian faculty advisor for a pre and post evaluation of study abroad courses.
- Courses taken as part of the CGIS Bologna program may be considered for 400-level credit.

**Cognate Course (optional)**

- 3 credits may be accepted from courses in a cognate field, selected in consultation with and approved by an Italian faculty advisor.

## Italian Major

### Prerequisite for the Major

Italian 230, 232, 233, or 410, or the equivalent

### Major Requirements

- A minimum of 30 credits in Italian courses numbered 235 and above.
- 12 credits must be conducted in Italian. Of these:
  - At least one course must be taught in Italian at the 200-level (235 and above)
  - At least one course must be taught in Italian at the 300-level
  - At least one course must be taught in Italian at the 400-level (on campus)
- At least one course at either the 300 or 400-level, taught in Italian, must be taken in RLL at the Ann Arbor campus.
- At least one course (three credits) must be focused on Italian literature and/or culture of periods prior to 1900.
- Three credits may be accepted from courses in a cognate field, selected in consultation with and approved by an Italian faculty advisor.
- Italian 410 (Italian for Spanish Speakers) does not count toward the Italian requirements for the major.

### Residence Requirement

- A maximum of 15 credits of out-of-residence courses are permitted. All other credits must be in-residence: taken on UM campus or with a study abroad program affiliated with UM (CGIS).

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Students who wish to pursue an academic major are strongly encouraged to make a general advising appointment to discuss degree requirements/options and to develop a plan for degree completion.
