### Research interests and experience

The central theme is the impact of gender, race, and ethnicity on and within social systems of various sizes and types and how to promote social justice and prevent social and individual problems, including interpersonal violence. How gender structures and dynamics are recreated is a major foci within this larger topic. Programs for alcohol and other drug problems were designed for and by (mostly white) men, so studying gender and race in this context is one useful arena. I have studied group dynamics in a number of contexts (within structured and "natural" small groups; also in the classroom); reactions to male and female, black and white authority figures; women's roles, groups, and organizations and differences among women within these; and processes related to race and gender that either impede or enhance

success for faculty within higher education. I have also conducted program evaluations of various kinds (as a vehicle for studying the organizations and dynamics within them) and conducted services research projects (on the implementation of services and the impact of social policies).
